Registration for MMR 2022 will open in mid-January 2022. Detailed registration instructions are online at <u>https://online-registration.musicalretreat.org</u>. Please read them carefully and ask questions as needed.

At registration you will indicate your preference for on or off campus housing, upload your COVID vaccination card, and pay the \$150 deposit. You will also submit your program preferences and a self-evaluation.

# Your Safety Is Our Priority

The MMR Board is implementing the following procedures to create the safest environment possible for MMR.

- At registration, all campers will be required to upload evidence of being fully vaccinated per CDC standards against COVID-19.
- All campers will be required to comply with Washington State COVID policies current as of July 2022 described in the following link at <u>coronavirus.wa.gov</u>.
- We will follow the current <u>WA state guidelines for Performing Arts and</u> <u>Events.pdf</u> relative to social distancing, masking, and bell covers. These guidelines may change with time.

# **Making Music at Midsummer Musical Retreat**



Midsummer Musical Retreat, MMR, is a week-long music camp and festival providing a non-competitive but challenging curriculum for adult singers and instrumentalists. Held on the beautiful campus of Whitman College in Walla Walla, Washington, participants from all over the United States, Canada, and around the world return to find the MMR experience to be invigorating, instructive and a rewarding part of their musical lives. Our MMR faculty are distinguished specialists in large ensembles and on all instruments, voices and genre. All are exceptional performers and dedicated, outstanding teachers who provide coaching for sectionals and chamber ensembles and teach electives.

## **Large Ensembles**



MMR participants are enrolled in one of the large ensembles. The large ensembles perform at the Festival Concert in Cordiner Hall. The morning rehearsal hours are focused on the large ensemble repertoire.

The **Festival Orchestra** is centered on the strings and balanced by winds and percussion. The repertoire is drawn from standard symphonic literature.

The **Festival String Orchestra** is "chamber orchestra" sized and celebrates the unique sound and literature for strings. The repertoire draws on the full range of string orchestra works from the Baroque to the 20th Century.

The **Festival Symphonic Band** explores the exciting literature available for concert and symphonic band, and may include transcriptions as well as original works for winds, brass and percussion.

The **Festival Chorus** prepares SATB music from major choral works for performance with the MMR Faculty Orchestra.

Daily sectionals with faculty specialists on all instruments and voices ensure successful performances at the Festival Concert and a well-earned sense of accomplishment.

#### **Chamber Music & Electives**



During the afternoon and evening, MMR singers and instrumentalists broaden their musical experience by electing to participate in a wide variety of small chamber ensembles and elective classes. Participants may also request chamber ensembles using a secondary instrument or voice, e.g. singers may request an instrumental ensemble; instrumentalists may request a vocal group; wind or brass players may request a string group; etc.

Chamber ensembles are either camper pre-arranged or MMR arranged. A member of the faculty is assigned to coach each ensemble to enhance their musical performance.

Participants may choose electives in conducting, drum circle, brass ensemble, saxophone ensemble, flute choir, clarinet choir, men's and women's barbershop, jazz improvisation, jazz big band, and many more.

- Free Time An unscheduled hour for relaxation or personal practice.
- Drum Circle Learn African and Latin drumming patterns.
- Jazz Big Band An ideal group for all who enjoy performing large ensemble jazz.
- Jazz Improvisation Open to instrumentalists and vocalists, this class will cover the basics of improvising: chord progressions, what scales to use with what chords, articulation styles, and how to develop a melody.
- Afternoon Elective Orchestra An afternoon ensemble for strings and classical brass, winds.
- The Well-Traveled Violinist A fun and instructive class for violinists at all levels featuring a common-sense approach to shifting, and a light touch, traveling up, down the fingerboard.
- Vocal Music from Africa Hesitant singers and veterans alike are invited to join in a celebration of vocal music from Africa. Join with members of the percussion elective to explore the rhythms of West African songs.

- Langston Hughes in Song Take this historic moment to explore and honor African American artists with our voices, including settings of the stirring poetry of Langston Hughes.
- Vocal Recovery A guide to returning to singing, Given the extended period of "silence" where choirs and singing have stopped due to COVID, we will focus on understanding changes to our anatomy and identify strategies to cope, overcome, and recover our singing ability.
- Vocal Chamber Ensemble Join coached vocal ensembles. You will be assigned to a chamber ensemble by the vocal coordinator. Open to all campers.

Instrumental Chamber Ensemble - Join coached instrumental ensembles. Bring your own chamber group or play with a chamber ensemble assigned by instrumental coordinators.

- Instrumental Ensembles (strings, winds, piano, etc.)

#### **Performances and Recitals**

Performances and recitals are held on the campus of Whitman College and open to the public. The final Festival Concert for the large ensembles is held in Cordiner Hall, the main

auditorium on the Whitman Campus. The final morning participant recital, two faculty recitals, and other participant performances are held in other venues on campus.

Performing is the usual end to the preparation of music. It is part of the process and should contribute to the "learning experience" for each camper. We encourage, but do not require, every group to find a venue to perform that suits their comfort level.

# **Refunds and Travel Insurance**

Prior to registering for MMR in 2022, take a few moments to review the <u>MMR</u> <u>Refund Policy at Fees | Midsummer Musical Retreat</u>. The MMR refund policy reflects the contractual obligations to the MMR Faculty and Whitman College. Depending on your situation and the date of the MMR defined contractual obligations, you may be entitled to all or a portion of the funds you pay to attend camp.

The MMR refund policy does not cover exceptional events, such as a mid-week closure of camp due to the outbreak of an infectious disease. It is possible to find a Travel Insurance policy that covers many types of travel disruptions, including a camp program disruption due to an outbreak of an infectious disease.

An MMR Board Member recently shared, "I was reading about COVID-related travel insurance and unsurprisingly, there are numerous options depending on what exactly your trip is. I think it would be good to direct campers to a resource and they can decide what works for them, as policies vary by age and type of travel (planes, any rental cars or layovers). I found a policy I'd be happy with pretty quickly."
